Board Meeting and Interviews Disrupted by Fire



On January 10th, at 9:00 a.m., the Kansas FBLA state officer board met in the Santa Fe Trail High School technology classroom. Board members discussed new by-law amendments, CTSO Legislative/Citizenship Day, State Leadership Conference plans, as well as recognizing and interviewing potential 2004-2005 state officer candidates before prematurely ending the meeting outside of the school building due to a fire in the basement of the school.

Beginning with an audience of nearly 30 hopeful candidates and advisers, the board meeting moved smoothly from the call to order by President, Lindy Brownback to short introductory speeches by each applied candidate. At this point the meetings were recessed for interviews where groups of four to five board members and advisers questioned each potential candidate with their adviser or parent on office duties and responsibilities as well as new ideas and activities outside of the FBLA organization. Interviews were then followed with a hot dog/chili dog feed provided by the Santa Fe Trail dance team, then the state officers met to exchange Christmas presents before reconvening the meeting.

As advisers and members filed into the classroom State Adviser Emily Sanders-Jones, announced that the building was on fire. Custodial crews instructed attendants to leave the classroom due to ventilation risks and reformed the meeting first in the hall and then outside the school. It was moved that officer reports be dismissed and Ms. Lindell made quick announcements for the upcoming CTSO Day, before President Lindy Brownback rapped the gavel on the concrete sidewalk beneath her to adjourn the meeting.

The school fire was later found to be an electrical fire from an industrial-size dryer in the school's basement. There were no injuries or smoke-inhalation-related illness and damage was contained to that single room.

Proposed Amendment

Article IV (Dues and Finance); Section 1. Currently Reads:
