Letter from the Mountain Plains Region Vice President

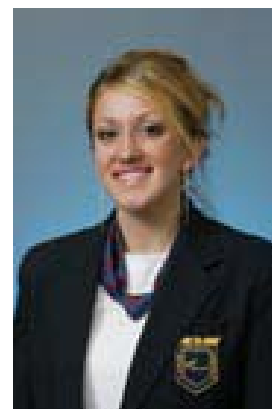

2. Click on the pink REGISTER ONLINE NOW button.

3. Select "I AM WALKING WITH A COMPANY, SCHOOL, ORGANIZATION, FAMILY, TEAM, OR OTHER GROUP" then click on the pink submit button.

4. On the next page, you will be provided with a list of teams. You will scroll to the "F" section and click on FBLA/PBL.

5. On the next page, select FBLA

6. On the next page, go to the drop down box next to the narrow search button. Drop down to Kansas and then click on the pink NARROW SEARCH BUTTON. This will filter out all FBLA groups but Kansas. Scroll down the list to find your school and then click on the school. Many FBLA chapters have not been entered yet. You can still register by typing in your school name. Make sure when you do this, you start with FBLA and then the name of your school. For example FBLA Rossville High School. You should not call

your team anything other than your school name.

7. Once you have selected your exact team, a page will be displayed showing your team information and walksite information. Pay no attention to the "walksite information". The March of Dimes office knows that all Kansas Team FBLA will be posted as one big team with each chapter as a sub-team. In our system, it defaults to the walksite closest to your city. DO NOT change the walksite information. On the lower portion of this page, you will enter information about yourself and your personal goal for WalkAmerica 2005. Please complete all the required fields and then click on the pink SUBMIT button.

NOTE: You are encouraged to complete the information as if your chapter was one walker. For example: in your personal information the first name would be Rossville and the last name would be Chapter. If you choose to collect and raise money as a chapter and not individually, this is the best way.

8. After successfully entering your personal information, a page will be displayed providing you information about your WalkAmerica 2005 webpage, and how to print off your sponsor form, and other information about raising money for WalkAmerica. You can click on the pink START FUNDRAISING NOW! button to view your website and begin raising money.

9. Once your website is set up, you have numerous options for changing the webpage. You can modify the text, insert your own photos, etc. Don't be afraid to play around. The more personalized the webpage, the more likely you are to receive support for WalkAmerica.

WHEN: March to Orlando activities kick off in January and will continue throughout the spring.

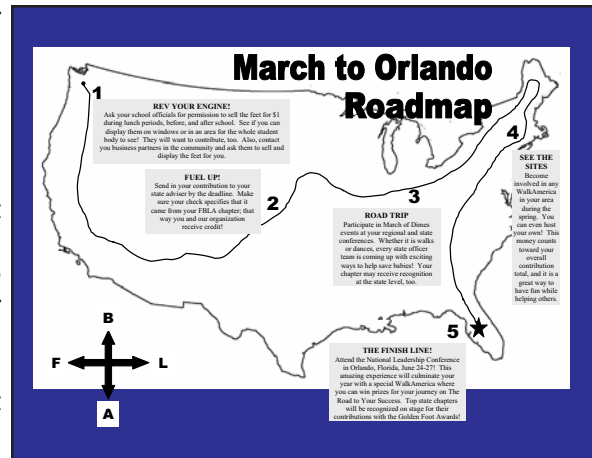
Recognition will occur at the National Leadership Conference.
